I have truly enjoyed seeing so many of you at Lake Days and other summer events. I thank God for the work you do and for allowing us at CFSF to be a part of it. Seeing the difference you are making in a child's life brings a smile to my face, warms my heart and lets me know the work we all do is not in vain.

At CFSF we hold you in high esteem and want your experience to be positive, no matter which children you are led to care for. From Respite to BRS, Adoption, Receiving Care, Tier 2 or Basic Placements, we are here for you.

As our state struggles to keep pace licensing new foster parents, we need to keep our lines of communication with you open. We need to be mindful of our current crisis and aware of potential pitfalls. Please read my following points with an open mind, and as always, feel free to contact me with any questions or comments.

- Please stay true to your calling. With your hearts of gold, you may feel called to serve children outside of your comfort zone, experience and training level. While this is noble, it can bring unwanted stress to your home. Here at CFSF we have wonderful people whose job it is to place kids in need of care, just as the state does. Please work with our placement staff prior to any placement.
- If you are looking for new challenges, please know we are here to explain your role and help identify needed training. With time and experience you may feel led to help kids you originally were reluctant to care for.
- Our state's foster care system is in crisis. Our state has paid up to \$500 per night per child, on a night-to-night basis. This is not a practice we feel comfortable with. We need to have permanency and best practice as our guide. Children are priceless, but extremely elevated reimbursement can blur our reasoning and night to night is not best for children.
- CFSF is growing across our state. We strive to work well with you and our state partners but need to be mindful of changes within our state. Adapting to changes and staying true to our mission takes work. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work together to bring permanency to our state's most vulnerable children.
