

An Overview of the Investigation Process for Caregivers

This 3-hour in-service training will provide foster parents, caregivers, relatives and fictive kin with information about LD/CPS and how LD/CPS works with caregivers and the community to ensure child safety. Participants will learn about mandated reporting, definitions and differences between allegations of abuse and/or neglect and licensing infractions, the flow of the investigative process when allegations are received, outcomes of investigations, and how caregivers can take steps to protect themselves in the process.
