If you had spent much time with Mateo a year ago, you would have quickly learned he had little to no vocabulary, nor any interest in using sign language. Over the last year, with the continuous support of his caregivers, speech and occupational therapists, Mateo's speech and sign language skills have tremendously increased! Not only has the amount of words he knows increased, but also how clearly he can say them! During a recent home visit, foster parents reported that Mateo now knows all of his colors, but also all of the planets! They have a giant chart of the solar system, and when pointed to and asked, Mateo can correctly name them all! He also learned a song with all of the planets in the correct order from the sun!
