Licensing Corner Just a little refresher from the Licensors.....

WAC 110-148-1590 Can I choose to give prescribed medications, including psychotropic medication?

- ♦ You must not start or stop giving a child's prescribed medication without approval from the child's physician.
- In addition to the physician, you must coordinate starting or stopping a child's psychotropic medication with the child's DCYF case-worker to determine what consent is needed. The caseworker may need to obtain consent from the child age 13 and older, parent or guardian, or the court.
- You must not give medications to a child that has been prescribed for someone else.
